

COMMUNITY SERVICE WORKER AND TEACHER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

JOB TRAINING PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY AT YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY SCHOOL

Neeginan College of Applied Technology and the St. James-Assiniboia School Division are working in partnership to offer a job training program for people to work in the schools as educational assistants, community workers, and to also provide a pathway for those that are interested in becoming a teacher.

Program Overview

In this year-long program, participants will learn the fundamentals of child development; how children process information and learn; group supervision and management. Participants will also learn Indigenous perspectives of knowing, being and doing; communication and advocacy skills; and leadership development. Practicums will be held within the schools of the St. James-Assiniboia School Division to provide students with on-the-job work experience.

Career Opportunities

Graduates will be qualified to work in a wide range of positions in the education and community service sectors. As well, graduates of the program will have the opportunity, if they are interested, to continue their education to become a teacher in a community-based Bachelor of Education program which is being developed at Neeginan College of Applied Technology.

Admission Requirements

Grade 12 is required, although alternative entrance options may be considered. A criminal record check is also required.

Program Supports

Participants will be paid a job training allowance while attending the program. Child care, transportation, and school supplies are funding supports that are also available. These supports are individually based - please contact Neeginan College of Applied Technology to determine funding eligibility.
