




## President's Remarks 2022

The past year has seen a lot of change, and a lot of new opportunities, for the St. James Scholarship Foundation.

In October 2022, a new School Board was elected in the St. James-Assiniboia School Division (SJASD). Notably, more than half of incoming Trustees have been elected for the first time. In order to maintain close ties with our School Board and Senior Administration, the St. James Scholarship Foundation presented at a School Board meeting in early 2023, informing all members of our history, governance, current operations and financial status.



Our Board of Directors also attended to several items of governance and administration over the past year. We passed a by-law amendment for a structured review of all awards for continued

financial viability, including a new notice procedure for our annual award donors to streamline their yearly approval process. We also conducted a complete review of our online presence to improve the information available to our students and the public. A director development meeting was held with Susan Hagemeister of the Winnipeg Foundation to help us gain insight regarding current ideas in donor stewardship.

This past year, our Board experienced some changes in membership. SJASD Information Officer Cory Cameron resigned to take up a new employment opportunity and was replaced by Michelle Lancaster. Rockford McKay also joined our Board. He has been an educator for 30 years in First Nation communities in Manitoba and Winnipeg. During this time as an educator, he became an author of science textbooks used in Manitoba classes. He is also a former member of the St. James-Assiniboia School Board. Our high school representative has also changed. St. James Collegiate Institute Principal Lorelei Steffler has been replaced by Collège Sturgeon Heights Collegiate Principal George Valentim. We thank those who are leaving our Board for their service and welcome our new members.

Our Foundation continues to receive administrative support from School Division employees. We are pleased to recognize Monika Kananowicz, Accounting Supervisor, Elizabeth Gwilliam, Management Secretary, and Michelle Lancaster, Communications Officer for their professional support and advice freely given to our Board.

Our School Division will continue to operate according to the governance and organizational model that our community expects and supports. We are pleased to continue our historical relationship with SJASD. As we look to the future, we are pleased to support our youth in their educational development in the way our community expects.

## The Winnipeg Foundation

## Partnership key to ensuring awards program continues to invest in students

In the 1980s, when I first became a Director of the St. James Scholarship Foundation, interest rates were much higher. A term investment at a financial institution could produce an annual rate of interest of 10 per cent.

This period of high interest rates was followed by a prolonged decline in rates producing much less than 2 per cent per annum on a term investment.


This was a difficult time for our Foundation as we began to experience levels of investment income that could not provide the cash required to fund all of our annual awards. Over a period of years, we had to reduce the scale of our awards. This situation was troublesome and unsustainable in the long term. We certainly did not want to see

the end of a community foundation that had served St. James since 1938.

We became aware of an opportunity to ameliorate the situation with the Winnipeg Foundation's Agency Fund program. In 2014, we established an Agency Fund with an initial transfer of \$20,000. The Winnipeg Foundation (WF) immediately matched this contribution up to \$15,000. Further dollar matching has been available as our account has grown.

This beginning provided significant benefit to our awards program with a reliable rate of return almost five times higher than our Guaranteed Investment Certificates (GICs) could produce.

Since then, our Agency Fund has accepted gifts from donors of \$10,000 or more to establish sub-funds to provide perpetual awards. Recently, we received two \$10,000 gifts to establish the Silver Heights 1960's Alumni Award at Collège Sturgeon Heights Collegiate and the George Chapman Family Award at St. James Collegiate. With these and other gifts, we now have 10 subfunds producing perpetual awards of \$500 for a worthy SJASD student each year.

The benefits of our partnership with the Winnipeg Foundation are not limited to the financial. We have also benefitted from board development opportunities such as presentations and seminars provided by their professional staff. On occasion, Winnipeg Foundation staff have attended our meetings to provide specialized advice on matters such as legacy giving.

We still maintain a local endowment fund for donors who prefer a term limited award. This local fund is augmented with annual income from the Winnipeg Foundation of almost \$12,000. Since 2014, this income has added almost \$50,000 to our endowment fund. While our Agency Fund has grown from that initial contributed captial of \$20,000 investment in 2013 to over \$236,000 in 2022 market value.

We look forward to the future growth of our Agency Fund and the awards program we sponsor. We have appreciated the growth we have experienced as a result of our partnership with the Winnipeg Foundation and we reflect often on the accuracy of their motto "For Good. Forever."



## St. James Scholarship Endowment Fund

Funds invested within the St. James Scholarship Endowment Fund are held separately with the Winnipeg Foundation. All gifts made to this fund are pooled and permanently invested to provide a stable, annual revenue stream and help support the long-term financial strategy of the St. James Scholarship Foundation.

## **Our History**

The history of the St. James Scholarship Foundation is a little like the history of St. James itself, a story of citizens getting together for the advancement of a common cause.

Founded in 1938 and incorporated by an act of funds were raised by a group of St. James the legislature in 1958, the St. James Collegiate Alumni. The St. James Scholarship Foundation Incorporation Act came into effect April 9, 1958. This began an era of more formal organization and a closer linkage with the administration of the school division, as well as the finance department. The foundation benefited greatly from this linkage as members of the finance department began to take on the role of Secretary Treasurer on the board. This significant expertise and experience helped best manage the Foundation's resources. During this period, donated capital was invested into guaranteed investment certificates (GIC) at banks and credit unions. The GIC provided safety for our capital and with historical high interest rates, income could endow an award in perpetuity.

Over time prevailing interest rates began to change and could no longer generate the income needed for the scale of the awards program. This resulted in some underfunded awards being discontinued. With no end in sight and the decline of interest income, the Foundation decided to take a new direction rather than reduce the program. In 2014, an agency fund was established at The Winnipeg Foundation. The fund was initially established with a

transfer of \$20,000 from our capital, which was matched with \$15,000 from The Winnipeg Foundation.

In a relatively short period of time, the agency fund has grown substantially. The agency now produces over \$12,000 of new revenue per year to benefit the awards program. The income produced has allowed for expansion in our program, such as in 2017, the Indigenous Leadership Award was introduced on an annual basis in the amount of \$1,000.

The agency fund continues to be of great benefit to donors. It works to enable perpetual awards and can accept donations in many forms as opposed to strictly cash. Donated funds now benefit from professional money management services provided by The Winnipeg Foundation producing income that more than doubles our GIC investments.

During this time the Foundation also developed a web presence on the St. James-Assiniboia School Division website. This enables interested members of the public to review our governance procedures, our meeting minutes and our annual reports. This access to information has been important in encouraging new donations.

The St. James Scholarship Foundation, partnered with The Winnipeg Foundation now sees a future of sustainability and growth. Our partnership continues to attract new donors, both private and corporate, to benefit deserving students in St. James-Assiniboia schools. The St. James Scholarship Foundation is a registered charity and all donations are tax deductible. As we reflect on our 80 years in the community, we look forward to continuing to grow our scholarships and awards to best support youth in accomplishing their dreams.

### **How to Donate**

The St. James Scholarship Foundation serves our award recipients and our donors by maintaining two endowment funds. These are funds on deposit with local financial institutions and our Agency Fund at the Winnipeg Foundation.

Prospective donors may choose to fund a new scholarship or alternatively, they may prefer to donate to the pooled fund in one of our two endowment funds. Prospective donors wishing to establish a new award are advised to contact the school principal at the chosen school to complete the application form required by the school division. Principals are able to give good advice on possible award criteria as they are very well aware of the needs of their students and their awards program. Alternatively, members of the scholarship board can be contacted for advice using the contact information listed below.

#### **Locally Endowed Awards**

Funds held in our local endowment are managed using GIC's at prevailing interest rates. Interest rates have been at historic low levels recently and for this reason they do not permit perpetual endowment of awards. Prospective donors are advised that our local endowment can support an award for a term of years. As an example, a donation of \$2,500 would support a \$250 annual award for approximately ten years. Donors may also choose to contribute to our general pool of funds and in this way provide a more general benefit to our fund.

### **Winnipeg Foundation Agency Fund Endowed Awards**

Prospective donors wishing to endow an award in perpetuity are able, through us, to establish a sub-fund within our Agency Fund. These donations must be a minimum of \$10,000 to be accepted by the Winnipeg Foundation. They also benefit from the dollar matching program at the Winnipeg Foundation. Because the Winnipeg Foundation employs a staff of professional money managers they can accept donations in a variety of forms such as investments, as well as cash. Again, to establish an award of this type prospective donors should first contact the school principal or the St. James Scholarship Foundation for advice. Prospective donors wishing to contribute to our pooled funds at the Winnipeg Foundation can make their donation directly to the Winnipeg Foundation referencing the St. James Scholarship Foundation Agency Fund.


