Smudging is an Indigenous tradition which involves the burning of medicines. It can produce a very distinct aroma, but the smoke associated with it is minimal and lasts a very short time.

A smudge is burned primarily for purification and to help to create a positive mind set. Under the Province of Manitoba's "*The Non-Smokers Health Protection Act*" smudging is permitted. The St. James-Assiniboia School Division has recognized that smudging ceremonies are a part of the Indigenous way of life and are therefore permitted in the division.

Smudging is a part of the school and classroom function. All are welcome to participate.
