DISCUSSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approval of Agenda

The agenda was adopted as circulated.

2. Funding Model Update

The Board of Trustees discussed the anticipated new funding model and expressed concern over the levels of funding and shortfalls that could occur without the ability to increase property tax.

3. Phoenix School

The Board of Trustees advised that the community of Headingley is growing quickly. Phoenix School and its gym are small and will soon not meet the needs of the community.

4. Coordinated Clinical Services

The Board of Trustees shared that the School Division employs a variety of individuals in the clinical and social supports field that go beyond the education mandate in order to develop appropriate supports and interventions for students as outlined in the appropriate education legislation.

The Board requested that additional funding and increased government services be considered to better assist in meeting the needs of students and families in our community.

5. Britannia Annex

The Board of Trustees shared that the School Division owns a surplus building that is leased out in its entirety to two childcare centres on a cost neutral basis. The building is older and requires ongoing maintenance which the childcare centres claim is a hardship to manage with their resources.

The Board suggested several options to address the concern, for further consideration.

6. InformNet Contract

The Board of Trustees provided a history of the InformNet program that provides online courses to grade 9 - 12 students throughout the province. The division operates the program with support of provincial funding and employs 13.5 permanent teaching units.

The Board requested timely follow-up from the Department of Education and Early Childhood Learning regarding the upcoming contract for partnering on this initiative.
