Instruction in the following curricula: Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education/Health and the Arts is focused on meeting the unique needs of Early Years students. Instruction focuses on the integration of subject matter and handson activity-based approaches to learning.

Last Year's School Accomplishments (2021-2022)

Students will:

- ✓ Develop a deep understanding of *Les apprentissages* essentiels and be able to apply the outcomes in all four competencies throughout the content areas.
- ✓ Be able to Identify as learners of French and as members of the French Immersion greater community.

École Assiniboine's professional staff continued to focus on Number Sense, Mental Math and Estimation.

Students will:

- ✓ Develop a deep understanding of numbers and number relationships and be able to apply this understanding to real world calculations and problem-solving.
- ✓ Be able to fluidly and flexibly work with numbers, make sense of what numbers mean, be able to perform mental math and make comparisons.
- ✓ Develop the ability to understand, explain, and justify the use of a particular mental math strategy in a variety of situations.
- ✓ Use manipulatives and visual models regularly to demonstrate conceptual and deeper understanding.

This Year's School Goals and Priorities (2022-2023)

French and English Literacy

To elicit and use evidence of student thinking in the assessment of reading as part of a rich balanced literacy approach in French Immersion.

Students will:

- Use strategies to increase and communicate their comprehension.
- Express critical thinking about their reading.
- Develop and communicate their identities as readers and writers.
- Advance on the reading progressions through the teachers' use of evidence-based practices.

Numeracy

To elicit and use evidence of student thinking in the assessment of progress toward mathematical understanding and to adjust instruction to support and extend learning.

Students will:

- Be actively engaged in tasks that align with Student Learning Outcomes and the Continuum of Thinking and Reasoning in Mathematics.
- Represent their thinking concretely, pictorially and symbolically.
- Demonstrate growth thinking and movement along the continuum.
- Engage in math talks, CGI (Cognitively Guided Instruction) problems, rich tasks and counting collections on a regular basis to deepen their mathematical understanding.

Mental Wellness

To strengthen mental wellness by using a variety of programs and resources.

Students will:

- Participate in mental wellness activities as part of their daily routines.
- Demonstrate calmness and practice strategies to be in the green zone.
- Construct meaning from their personal responses to difficult situations.
- Advance on the mental health checklist progressions from the physical education curriculum.
