#### PRINCIPALS REPORT

Principal's report – May 8th , 2024 Parent Advisory Council We currently have 317 students and 36 staff members. Since our last meeting, we had several students participate in the divisional Concours d'art oratoire (public French speaking celebration), Heritage Fair and the provincial Concours d'art oratoire. Now that the weather is a bit warmer, our students are using the Bike cage more and more. We had our Grade 5 patrol celebration with Constable Diana Cross, our divisional School Resource Officer who has returned to general patrol. Our new SRO will be Constable Sean Murphy. Students have participated in bus ridership. Our grade 3-5 students who are interested in the divisional choir took part in the Spring Sing. We had another fantastic Spring Concert on May 1st and 2nd with the Spring Concert for the Kindergarten – grade 2 students. Thanks for all of those who came out to see our kids present. We once again have students going to St. James Collegiate for salon days. A huge thank you to the Parent Advisory Council who spoiled us immensely during Teacher Appreciation Week last week. It was incredible and the teachers really do feel fortunate that we are in such a wonderful community.

May and June will also be quite eventful. Thursday evening for the grade 4 and 5 students, we will be having a Flag Football activity with some of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers after school for students who have signed up. We can look into purchasing a non-dairy dessert option if it is needed.
- Prizes for students; we would like to offer a goodie bag/prizes for students after they complete all the carnival games/stations. There would be a stamp card that is created (also printed at the school) and volunteers would stamp the card once each student has completed the game. Suggestions for prizes were notepads, pens/pencil, stickers, and Mott's fruit gummies.
