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The Early Years (K-5) provides a nurturing environment where children are encouraged to investigate, create and discover. Children develop their competencies in language and literacy skills, thinking and problem-solving skills, social and emotional development, independence, creativity and knowledge in preparation for becoming responsible citizens. Instruction in the following curricula: Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education/Health and the Arts is focused on meeting the unique needs of Early Years students. Instruction focuses on the integration of subject matter and hands-on activity-based approaches to learning.

Last Year's School Accomplishments (2018-2019)

Athlone's professional staff continued their analysis of student writing samples at two points in the year and subsequently planned for the next steps in teaching.

- ✓ Used inservice day and staff meetings to implement grade level writing samples analysis.
- ✓ Revisited writing continuums to determine accepted exemplars of typical and exceptional writing skills at all grade levels.
- \checkmark Literacy Committee continued to meet and offered support to classrooms.

Athlone's professional staff looked to improve student problem-solving skills by developing an instructional focus to direct teach and model strategies.

- \checkmark Students were regularly exposed to open –ended and closed problems
- \checkmark School Numeracy Committee organized a Family Math Night.
- ✓ Numeracy Committee developed problem -solving skill binders for every grade level to use.
- ✓ Used inservice day to implement grade level problem-solving analysis.

Athlone's professional staff focused on improving the reading scores of its SDA students.

- \checkmark Application was submitted and was approved for AAA EA support in the middle term.
- ✓ There was direct teaching and modelling of decoding skills
- ✓ Students received regular practice using daily guided reading; re-reads with reading buddies
- ✓ Literacy Committee and School PIA created a cabinet of resources/activities for volunteers, EAs, etc.. to use with all readers they were working with for quick mini -lessons etc..

A Quick Snapshot of the Classroom

ELA: A divisional Literacy coach will assist teachers in planning for student learning as part of three 2-week blocks this year. The teaching staff will continue to analyze student writing samples twice during the school year with a focus on tracking student growth.

Mathematics: The School's Numeracy goal is to focus on student problemsolving skills, specifically student communication of their thinking. Students will be provided with opportunities to collaborate with others and experiment with strategies in order to make sense of problems. Teachers consolidate the learning by helping students make connections.

Mental Health: The school will continue with safe and caring initiatives (eg. WITS, TAG meetings, Great Kindness Challenge, etc..) and will seek out professional development on positive mental health practices for students and staff and their families. Indigenous Education Teacher, Richelle Scott, will work with all classrooms this year on Indigenous perspectives using traditional teachings to build community and wellness within our classrooms.

Planning & Goal Setting

School goals are created using the Divisional Strategic Plan as the guideline (www.sjasd.ca/Documents/stratplan_2016-21.pdf). The goal setting process begins in early Spring and includes input from students, teachers, parents and the community. Goals are developed around the needs and direction of the various departments with student progress and achievement and our mission and vision statement as our focus.
