Important Winter Concert News

Please also be sure to hang up your coats before sitting, in order to save space for others and sit closely in the pews so all attendees have a place to sit. Finally, there will be chairs set up in overflow areas; no one is permitted to stand along the back.

Cold Weather, Clothing and Safety

As the cold weather is now upon us, information relating to important guidelines about temperatures and bussing cancellation is included in a separate section. Please read this section carefully. When the temperature meets the indoor recess guidelines in the morning before school, please have your child come directly into the school. They are not to arrive before 8:50 am as there is no supervision until this time. When they come in, they are directed to sit quietly in the hallway, with their belongings, outside their classroom. They are not to enter the classroom until their teacher greets them when the bell rings at 9:00 am. Please be sure your child(ren) is dressed appropriately for the weather and that all their belongings are labelled.

Please be reminded that on regular school days, students are not to come in the front door and linger near their classroom as there is no supervision. If they are dropped off at the front doors, please do not escort them to their classrooms; they should go directly to the playground until the bell rings at 9:00. There is supervision on the playground from 8:50 until 9:00. Adults are also asked to not use the back doors to enter the school with students; those doors are for student entry and dismissal only. It is extremely hectic during entry and dismissal times, so please allow students only to enter and exit safely from these doors. Their teachers greet them and help them with their belongings, so adults are not permitted to enter with them. All adults are to use the front doors and report to the office when visiting.

Finally, please ensure to respect the 30 km per hour speed limit in and around our school neighbourhood. Many students walk to school, so maintaining respect of these speed limits while driving and paying attention to pedestrians, will help to ensure they are able to cross intersections safely.
