LAST YEAR'S BROAD AREAS OF FOCUS

What did the evidence of student learning tell us?

Literacy Instruction: Students would benefit from an increased focus on strengthening our students' ability to generate and communicate their ideas while writing, as well as increasing their stamina for written tasks.

Numeracy Instruction: Students required more explicit instruction in the area of problem solving in order to increase their ability to concretely, pictorially, and symbolically represent their thinking.

Family and Community Connections: We strove to increase parent/family participation and involvement in the school experience with their children through a variety of community building activities, celebrations, performances, and experiences.

What are the anticipated next steps?

-Staff will use a variety of data sources (report cards, provincial assessments, work samples, observations, and conversations) to gauge student progress throughout the year.

-Common/core assessments and selected daily routines will be used to guide instruction in the area of problem solving to represent student thinking and understanding.

-Staff will continue to find authentic and relevant ways to engage our families in the school experience. We are also striving to enhance the methods of communication that are utilized to keep our families informed of what is happening in the school.

IDENTIFIED AREAS OF FOCUS

Buchanan School goals are created under the umbrella of the St. James-Assiniboia School Division Strategic Plan (2023-2027). The divisional strategic plan priorities are:

Buchanan staff met consistently over the course of the 2023-24 school year to monitor the progress of our literacy, numeracy, and family/community connection goals. Through the months of September and October we completed a variety of formative assessments with students, reviewed year end report card data as well as the results of

the caregiver survey completed in June.

Through this collaborative process, we were able to identify the focus areas for this school year.

Literacy: Writing with explicit instruction related to idea generation and basic conventions.

Numeracy: A focus on increasing students' ability to represent their thinking in problem solving situations.

Family/Community Connections: To further strengthen and enhance positive communication and relationships with our families.
