Lunch Program

Golden Gate Middle School provides a free lunch program for students who are unable to go home for lunch.

- Program or Non-Lunch Program (ie. Going home for lunch)
- Daily lunch attendance taken at beginning of school day, and prior to lunch. If part of lunch program, and going home for lunch, a note is required to be submitted to Homeroom Teacher giving permission.
- Non-lunch students required back on school property between 12:35 and 12:40 pm.
- No one leaves school property without written parent permission. Safety in knowing.
- Students eat in their classroom. Bag lunch or pre-heated thermos required no microwaves.
- NO cell phones/electronic devices in lunch program.

Does My Child Need a Cell Phone?

Golden Gate Middle School provides a school environment that nurtures the physical and social, and emotional well-being of our students.

- A phone is not required for classroom learning and participation.
- Cell phones are left secured in the locker throughout the school day.
- During lunch hour, cell phones are left in locker to encourage students to be active playing sports, playing with friends, pursuing an activity offered, making a friend and socializing with other people.



Transportation

Students entering Grade 6 are eligible for transportation service if the walking distance to their **catchment area school** exceeds 1.6 km.

- The catchment area for Golden Gate is:
- ✓ North side: Saskatchewan Avenue, South side: Assiniboine River
- West side: heading from Moray Street Bridge along Portage Avenue to the back lane between Thompson and Nightingale, across Ness Avenue (including Strauss & Thompson Dr. North) to Silver Avenue and then north to Sturgeon Rd.
- Our East side: the back lane between Duffield and Sharp Blvd. to Silver Avenue and then northeast to Truro Creek (including Hangar Line, Ottawa Avenue, Canberra Avenue etc.)

Non-residents and non-catchment area students must provide their own transportation to our school.

Please be advised that the Board of Trustees for the St. James-Assiniboia School Division approved the following motion at its regular scheduled Board Meeting of February 6, 2024:

"That the monthly purchase bus seat rate be increased to \$70 per month, effective for the 2024/25 school year.

And further; that the rate for additional siblings in a family remain \$26 per month for the 2024/25 school year."

This rate change will be in effect beginning September 2024.

Please note that at this time <u>no purchase seats are being offered for the 2024-2025 school year</u>. Your school will update you after November 1, 2024 if an opportunity to apply for purchase seats becomes available, based on individual routes Costs are pro-rated based on monthly ridership.
