- i. School Start up Good start, everything is open and back to sports. Students transitioning with routines.

 home.
- iii. Manitoba Remote Learning Center Our school is the learning hub for the Provincial Learning Center. We have allocated 3 classrooms, 2 office spaces and parking for the program.
- iv. Locks/lockers Transitioning going well, and students respectful about their lockers. Students asked if can have locks as additional security measure for their personal belongings and cell phones. We agreed and have provided time to teach, learn and practice use of locks.
- v. Immunization Vaccination Clinic
- vi. Bike Program
 Divisional Initiative: It has been wonderful to see this program roll out these past few days. Students are learning safety, and some are learning how to ride a bike for the first time. This program will be in our school next spring as part of the divisional rotation of bikes.

Please be respectful of teacher's time. Exercise a 24 hour rule to allow teachers to respond to parents, and avoid weekends. Discussed how Principal avoids teacher emails on weekend as well. staff cannot always get to emails and so we ask that parents give them time to respond. We are encouraging our staff to block out their weekends so that they can have a balanced work/family life.
