#### **GRADUATION INFORMATION**

All graduation information will be located on our school website (About Us--> Graduation). Please ensure you continue to monitor your email and school instagram for additional information.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

Any scholarship information will be posted on our school website (Programs-->Awards). If students are requesting letters of reference, teachers/admin require a minimum of 3 days notice.

#### **GRAD PHOTOS**

There is NO fee for students to have their graduation photo taken for our composite that will hang proudly in the JT halls for years to come. ## CONVOCATION

## **GRAD DINNER & DANCE**

## SAFE GRAD

Safe Grad is a **parent-organized** celebration held immediately after the grad dinner and dance. Its primary goal is to provide a safe, enjoyable environment for graduates to celebrate their achievements without the risks associated with unsupervised parties. **Please begin to consider if you are interested in partaking in the organizing committee in the fall.** 



# FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

#### Grad Cap & Gown

This fee covers the cost of the rental of the robe and stole. Grads get to keep their cap. Estimated cost of \$35.

#### **Dinner & Dance**

Fundraising efforts will attempt to bring down the cost of the grad dinner and dance tickets. Typically dinner tickets will cost anywhere from (\$85-\$90 per ticket).

#### Grad Wear & Memorabilia

Students will have the opportunity to order Senior Shirts, grad wear (hoodies, shirts, etc) and grad rings. **These purchases are all optional and individual.** 

#### FUNDRAISING

To help bring down the costs of the dinner ticket, grad fundraisers will take place over the course of the year. Please keep your eyes and ears open as more information comes out in the fall.

## **VOLUNTEER HOURS**

Although volunteer hours are no longer a mandatory requirement for graduation, the hours accumulated are highly regarded for scholarships and awards. Students must submit their hours / log sheets by mid-May to ensure timely consideration. Reminders will be sent home throughout the year.

#### **CFE CREDITS**

Grade 12s who completed their LifeWorks10 credit in grade 9 are able to earn up to 2 Credit For Employment credits while working. Students can check in with Ms. Goetz to receive the forms and get more information on the process.

#### **GRAD POW WOW**

Each May SJASD holds a Divisional Grad Pow Wow. Students who are self-declared will automatically be sent an invitation in the Spring.

#### **SELF-DECLARATION**

We encourage our Indigenous and Metis families to fill out their self-declaration forms as many opportunities, scholarships and experiences will come up over the year.

# **Important Notes**

#### **STUDENT DRIVERS**

Students who wish to transport other students on field trips or sporting events MUST have volunteer student driver forms filled and submitted to the office at least 1 week prior to the event. Students must fill out parking forms and pay the parking fee if they wish to park in the school lot.

## **STUDENTS WHO TURN 18**

Once your child turns 18, the school can no longer legally communicate with parents about their school information. As we believe that parents and caregivers are instrumental to our partnership in helping kids succeed, two weeks prior to your child's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday, the school will send a 18+ communication consent form home for you and your child to review, sign and return.

## **TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS**

Students who require transcripts for postsecondary applications or scholarships will be able to request them online in the fall. More info to come.

## **ALTERNATE GRADUATION PLAN**

Students who have not met graduation requirements for June 2026 will work closely with admin, guidance and resource to develop an alternate graduation plan. Our team looks forward to work closely with families to help support the plans that will be developed.

# **Post-Secondary Planning**



Guidance will continue to check in with students in regards to post-secondary planning and application processes and timelines. We also post all post-secondary open house dates on our website (Programs--> Post Secondary).

Students and families are responsible for ensuring they have all credits needed to graduate as well as any pre-requisites required for any post-secondary programs that their child is considering.

# **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

As a reminder, Manitoba Provincial High School Diploma is earned when students have:

- earned 30 credits
- 6 credits must be at the grade 12 level
- compulsory credits are earned from 9-12 (English, Math, Phys. Ed)
