You must have achieved a minimum average grade of 75% for the two English 40S courses (NB: Some health-related programs don't allow this to be one of the waivers)</li> </ul> <p>2) Don't qualify for a waiver? Applicants must submit a transcript of the completed Grade 11 subjects and confirmation of enrolment in Grade 12 prerequisite subjects.</li> </ul>

<b>Self-Reporting Grades</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>When applying to the U of W or the U of M, you will be asked to submit your expected or final Grade 12 marks for all Grade 12 courses you have taken or are currently taking</li> <li>The grades you report will either be final grades that have been confirmed on your report card, or expected grades that you believe you will attain at the end of the year.</li> <li>You can estimate expected grades on a number of things such as how well you did in similar courses in Grade 11, if you have received interim Grade 12 marks, or how well you are doing in the course so far, based on tests or papers you have done</li> <li>The University will automatically request official final Grade 12 transcripts from the high schools for all students that apply by June 1. All courses and grades submitted will be verified based on these transcripts. In the event of a discrepancy between the grades you report and the grades received from the high school, the latter will be used as the final official mark. Applicants do not need to contact the Admissions Office if original estimates were too high or too low, as official transcripts will be requested by the university directly to the school.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You do not self-report grades.</li> <li>Transcripts and all supporting documents must be submitted by the student directly to the university (in-person or mailed in)</li> <li>There is often a deadline to submit these documents (i.e. 30 days after applying) – a good idea to ensure you have all documents prior to applying</li> <li>Originals, not photocopies</li> </ul>
