Our Team will: Analyze the Reading Wall data and on demand writing samples regularly to inform instruction. Reference the physical display of typical reading and writing samples for each grade. Resource and Reading Recovery will observe and assist with the collection of data for each grade level. (BURT, writing vocabulary task, running records, independent writing samples, etc.).
