<p>Teachers will:</p> <p>Observe all students using the classroom literacy survey to identify their strengths and areas of concern.</p> <p>Meet as a grade group team along with Resource, Reading Recovery and co-teaching team to plan for all students' needs.</p> <p>Use the Optimal Learning Model to model multiple comprehension strategies for reading.</p> <p>Use the Optimal Learning Model to model what great writers do.</p> <p>Teach self-assessment strategies related to reading and writing.</p>	<p>Teachers will:</p> <p>Meet in grade groups to review the OLM and visible thinking routines in order to teach effective strategies.</p> <p>Work with grade groups to plan sprints and review student progress regularly.</p> <p>Look at examples of self-assessment for reading and writing.</p>	<p>Our Team will:</p> <p>Analyze the Reading Wall data and on demand writing samples regularly to inform instruction.</p> <p>Reference the physical display of typical reading and writing samples for each grade.</p> <p>Resource and Reading Recovery will observe and assist with the collection of data for each grade level. (BURT, writing vocabulary task, running records, independent writing samples, etc.).</p>	<p>Our Team believes:</p> <p>That continuous assessment of data is important to track student's growth and to inform instruction.</p> <p>In informing our community to understand what reading and writing looks like at each grade level throughout the year and how to support their child at home.</p>
