The programs in the Middle Years build on the programming in the Early Years.

A Quick Snapshot of the Classroom

Integration of Content Areas: Deep Learning Progression continuums will be used to measure students' deep understanding of both communication and critical thinking skills. Teachers will integrate and work collaboratively to support students' efforts to demonstrate connections and learning across different content areas. For example, students explore themes and real-world topics that connect for example their understanding in numeracy with building structures in Science or world news in Social Studies with power and agency in Language Arts.

Mathematics: Mathematics teachers collaborate to develop grade level strategies to enhance students' mental math strategies. Rich and open-ended tasks provide opportunities for students to apply mathematical concepts from the classroom to real-world situations. In addition, a focus on different ways to communicate information and understanding will provide teachers with different ways support student learning and measure what students learned.

Language Arts: Literacy skills taught in Language Arts are incorporated across all subject areas. Both communication and critical thinking are skills outcomes used across the curriculum. In Language Arts students have opportunities to integrate their learning through different cross-curricular themes, as well as different types of text such as videos, blogs, social media type text, as well as more traditional print text. Language Arts teachers collect writing samples, analyze the data with their grade level team and use the data to develop programming for student groups and individuals.

Science and Social Studies: Teachers integrate the use of technology, as well as local and global community connections so that students have a better understanding of how their classroom learning connects to everyday life. Students will have different opportunities to communicate their learning in different ways. A wide variety of choices is also offered to support students' interests when they delve more deeply into a topic that requires critical thinking. Achieving their personal best and mastering both concepts and skills such as problem solving and extending their learning are goals for all students.

Arts: Students are immersed in a wide variety of arts choices throughout the grades. Initially these come as exposure to different art forms, and then later change to include many opportunities for students to choose art forms that appeal to students. Every year, Art and Music teachers provide opportunities for students to extend classroom learning to real life situations that include band and choral festivals, the division art show, dance festivals, improv evenings in front of an audience, and musical/drama productions.

Planning & Goal Setting

School goals are created using the Divisional Strategic Plan as the guideline (www.sjasd.ca/Documents/stratplan_2016-21.pdf). The goal setting process begins in early spring and includes input from students, teachers, parents and the community. Goals are developed around the needs and direction of the various departments with student progress and achievement and our mission and vision statement as our focus.
