3) Outdoor classroom Update Grant proposals [Brea] Media articles, video [Kyle] Capital fundraising (SimplyK setup?) Student engagement [Brea]
a) Tayler (Little Bluestem)- Drawings are similar to last time, plantings updated with native plants or a cultivar of a native plant, which makes it easier to find plants locally.
Minimum grade included to ensure no pooling of water next to benches. Contractor is responsible to ensure that minimum/maximum grade is met.
Recommend cages around all the planting to avoid breakage of plants when they are getting established. Suggest leaving this up for two years until plants are established. This is a good point to meet with School Division to incorporate any concerns, comments. Drawings to be sent to Division for review, and a meeting can be held via Zoom if necessary.
Most recent invoice has been paid by Parent Council.
b) Grant proposals- Grant received from City of Winnipeg, for $\$ 60,000$. Still need to figure out contracts, etc. A few other, smaller grants are outstanding.
Announcements coming in March for Sustainable Communities Grant.
c) Media Articles (Mr. Lizotte)- Kirkfield/Westwood newsletter will include an article in the April issue (delivery late March). Will give publication rights to the Headingley Times to publish there, and this can be published by the school as well. Winnipeg Free Press community distribution will include an article for all of Western Winnipeg. This will hopefully pique the interest of the community, and hope to generate donations.
d) Student Engagement (Ms. Jones/Brea)- Working on student videos to highlight benefits of outdoor classroom. Will be shared on Feb 22 with all the students. Images created by Brea will be posted around the school. Goal is to inform students
of how Parent Council is raising funds to create the outdoor classroom for benefit of the student.

## 3. Recent School Events, Clubs and Supports of/for Learning:

## - Academics:

- Recent professional development on Feb. $4^{\text {th }}$ focused on all elements of our school plan and ensuring accountability.
- SNAP math assessments focused on student growth in numeracy have been developed for monthly use. This has been exemplary for the division.
- On-Demand Writing Samples are on full display in the library with targeted strengths and needs identified. Grade 6, 7, 8- typical samples of Lincoln students for all grades. Helps to ground teachers in what they are teaching, and gives students great feedback.
- Arts:
- Concert and Rock band continues
- Surveys about band were provided to current 6's for feedback for Mr. Kehler
- Arts Education surveys were provided to current 7's for feedback for planning staff.


## - Athletics:

- Basketball seasons is underway with all games livestreamed.
- Home game spectators are now permitted. Capacity limitations at some schools prevent visiting team parents.
- Coaches have encouraged students dressing up for games- lots of spirit in the school, great atmosphere
- School Wide Initiatives and Upcoming Events:
- I Love to Read Month is underway with different events each day throughout the month. We're hoping parent council can contribute funds towards the event for student and classroom prizes like in previous years.
- Black History Month is being recognized throughout the month with featured books during I Love to Read Month as well as "Figures of Appreciation" on our Instagram and daily announcements. The blizzard canceled the kick-off of Black History Monthdisappointing, however, rescheduled for March 3 to end off the month.
