Outdoor Classroom Update from Tayler from Little Bluestem:

- Drawings have been revised to accommodate the boulder spacing as requested by the division. Bench options have been revised and the granular area has been expanded.

- Plant varieties, shrubs, maintenance budgets were all discussed.

- Next steps will require a thorough review with the division (Randy Calvert) to ensure the plans can move ahead once the 60% drawings have been received.
