• Recent School Events, Clubs and Supports of/for Learning:

Academics:

- Throughout the months of November and December, homerooms are travelling to experience the Witness Blanket at Bruce Middle School to connect and further understand the impact of residential schools in Canada.
- Term 2 is underway with all students transitioning to new Practical Arts and Creative Arts classes.
- Provincial math (grade 7) and English language arts (grade 8) assessments are underway.

Arts:

- Our grade 8 concert band and Community Impact class visited the 529 Country Club care home to perform and connect with their residents and to spread some holiday cheer.
- Our Lincoln Choir sang in the Candlelight Concert at My Church located at 955 Wilkes.
- Our Grade 6, 7, and 8 concert bands, Jazz band, dance troupe, and choir all performed at our Winter Concert Evenings on December 6th and 7th. Each evening was well attended, and positive feedback provided from our community in regards to separate nights and shorter events overall.
- Rehearsals for our school musical "Newsies" have begun. Performances will happen on the afternoons and evenings of April 22nd and 23rd at the Westwood Collegiate Theatre.
- Lincoln Rockband has returned! Mr. Kehler has taken on this long standing tradition at Lincoln and will be working with students in the months ahead as they prepare for performances later this year.
- We were successful applicants for the Manitoba Arts Council Artists in the School initiative and are able to partner with local muralist, Annie Bergen to continue making large scale murals with a designated grade level. This will happen in May, 2024.

Athletics:

- Atomic, Tier 2 and Tier 1 basketball season is underway. Teams have been formed and games will begin later this month. Currently our Tier 1 and 2 teams (both boys and girls) practice together to increase skill development and create a cohesive and supportive environment.

School Wide Initiatives:

- Spirit Week happened during the week of Dec. 18th Dec. 22nd.
- Our contributions of donated items (non-perishable food and hygiene products) were greatly appreciated by the staff and students at CSHC in support of the Pros vs Joes event. We donated over 1500 items and one of our students won the Rock Paper Scissors divisional tournament!
- All grade 7's went to the Canadian Human Rights Museum
- Community Impact class visited the Agape Table Inc. to build and distribute hampers to those in need.
- We will be partnering with Elder Belinda Vandenbroeck to learn more about the tradition of oral history and storytelling. This will happen during January and February.
- February 5th MADD Canada will present to all Grade 8 students.
- February 23rd MTYP will perform Snow White for all students.
- SJASD Open House and registration information will be provided to all students and families by the end of the month.

- Student feedback provided within our Lincoln based survey has provided us with reason to change our lunch time routines.
