4.7. COVID Questions (Standing Agenda Item)

Question about lockers- a plan is in place. Kids would come into school, go to homeroom. To access locker, still need to maintain 1-2 meters of distance. Kids would be broken into 4 waves. Kids go to locker, then next group would go. Difficulty is loss of in-class instructional time. Supplies will be in classroom, no locks on lockers but kids will store outdoor clothing in lockers. Challenges with carrying extra clothing being carried. Plan is in place to start once weather requires it. Will start classroom by classroom. An extra wipe down will occur for lockers in between uses- partway through morning and partway through afternoon.

5.2. Fundraising- Possible fundraisers for 2020-2021

Past two years: toonie drive, Fundscrip (Christmas and Easter), pizza
In the interest of simplicity, would like to look at toonie draw and potentially Fundscrip
Marian and Corrie to review Fundscrip. Easy fundraiser. Spreadsheets are already developed.
Office assisted with printing forms.

Do we need to quarantine anything coming in from the kids?

Have we looked at any complete online fundraisers?

Flipgive was raised as an option- online shopping contributes 1-4% of the purchase to the school. Fundscip delivered approx. \$30, 000 worth of gift cards. Delivered to school, parents had to pick up or had to send a letter to the school to allow kids to pick up. Raised about \$12,000 last year.

Distribution is a challenge, but it can be worked around.

Toonie draw much more difficult due to COVID, but cleared between 2-3000 that went to legacy account.

Decision made to go ahead with Fundscrip immediately, with a plan to distribute gift cards before the holiday break. Brea, Marian, and Corrie to provide forms and information to the school. Will also look into FlipGive and consider setting up an account, and getting information to parents in December or January.
