Pizza lunches-

- In past years, pizza/fun lunch raised a good amount each month. Discussion regarding potential to do this again this year
- At this time, visitors and volunteers are not allowed onsite
- Discussion about options to offer fun lunches safely, without adding additional work to teachers and school staff.
- Would work best to have fun lunches for two classes per week, and rotate throughout the month to minimize congestion in hallways and work for school staff
- A pre-ordered lunch would be preferable to minimize waste. Order would include pizza for staff who are helping with the fun lunc
- Discussed Munch-a-Lunch, which allows online ordering, and all money is handled through the app. Cost is estimated at \$300/year. Would need to ensure that sales cover the cost. All other fundraising can be handled through Munch a Lunch as well

Other fundraising:

- Fundscrip- works well for holidays, last year made \$1600.
