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The Middle Years (Gr. 6 -8) provides a stimulating and supportive learning environment where high expectations, collaboration and continual learning are promoted. Early adolescents have unique emotional, social and developmental characteristics. Staffing, curricula and programming in middle schools are focused on meeting these needs. The programs in the Middle Years build on the programming in the Early Years.

Last Year's School Accomplishments (2018-2019)

École Ness' professional staff focused on the area of student assessment with emphasis on communication in mathematics.

- ✓ Report card data, provincial assessment data, and school-wide problemsolving analysis were used to inform instruction.
- ✓ Students engaged in authentic problem-solving learning opportunities designed to encourage asking questions that allow students to grapple with ideas and relationships.
- ✓ Numeracy team created a document to support new members with implementation of best practices, resources and hands-on/experiential learning activities.

École Ness' staff and students continued to focus on creating a community/culture of French language learners.

- ✓ Students improved their confidence, fluency and frequency of use in French language and identify as part of the French community.
- ✓ Students demonstrated persistence and perseverance when communicating in French.
- ✓ Teachers continue to integrate "la francophonie" into lessons and units (music, radio, etc.)
- Teachers provided regularly scheduled class time for authentic conversations

École Ness' professional staff continued to focus on deepening the readingwriting connection across the curriculum.

- ✓ Teachers prioritized authentic reading/writing experiences that provided an opportunity for students to read/write with power and agency and therefore, empowered them to advocate for themselves, their communities, and the environment.
- ✓ Language rich classroom libraries with a wide variety of reading genres continued to be a focus.
- ✓ Teachers collaborated and established common criteria for assessment rubrics.

 Teachers examined typical writing samples across the grades to create "I can" statements for the students at each grade level.
- ✓ Analysis of writing samples was used to establish writing goals and next steps in instruction and common vocabulary was created and infused in instruction across the grade levels

A Quick Snapshot of the Classroom

Across the curriculum students are working towards deepening their understanding and learning by developing and strengthening global competencies with a focus on Communication.

Students will:

- -Communicate effectively with a variety of styles, modes, and tools including digital
- -Communicate for different audiences
- -Reflect on and use of the process of learning to improve communication

As a school we have developed common belief statements in literacy and numeracy.

Literacy Belief Statements:

- The more writing students do, the better readers they become.
- Shared writing is an excellent way to include all students' thinking and connect to reading.
- Reading excellent literature and/ore hearing quality literature read aloud positively influences students' writing quality.

Students are working towards improving their ability to read a variety of genres, in French and English, in order to interpret and evaluate information critically considering various points of view and write in order to communicate their thinking.
