LAST YEAR'S BROAD AREAS OF FOCUS

What did the evidence of student learning tell us?

Assessment data was examined, and responsive instructional programming was undertaken. In the area of Literacy, there was a continued focus on reading comprehension and written expression. The Optimal Learning Model, Shared Reading, and Shared Writing experiences were implemented. UFLI and a renewed focus on Phonics instruction in teaching reading was adopted in the Primary grades. Oral language, reading, and writing connections were an on-going area of emphasis.

What are the anticipated next steps?

In the area of Numeracy, students focused on communicating their mathematical thinking in the areas of problem solving and number sense. Students shared math strategies and used their preferred strategies to solve problems.

In the area of Wellness, students were provided with mental health instruction to foster the development of positive coping and mental health wellness strategies. Wellness Wednesday groups met and practiced yoga, meditation, and calming activities.

IDENTIFIED AREAS OF FOCUS

Literacy: Connecting oral language to reading and writing will be an area of emphasis. Phonics instruction (UFLI) will play a renewed role in the teaching of reading. Literacy common assessments and Acadience Screening will be implemented. The new ELA Curriculum will be explored and fully implemented at the K-3 level.

Numeracy: School wide routines which include a variety of rich daily tasks to foster critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Mental math strategies will be explored and applied when problem solving.

Mental Health: Class Treaties, Class meetings, Yoga, Smudging, Meditation, Zones of Regulation, Project 11, and Calming corners will be integrated into daily classroom routines and procedures.
