With the melting temperatures, the snow is beginning to melt and leave us large puddles and muddy fields. We have been asking students to stay out of the large puddles to avoid getting soaked. It would be a good idea to pack some extra **dry clothes** for those who run into slips and falls while on the playground!

Covid-19 Update:

Since returning from Spring Break, students are no longer are restricted to staying with their grade/ group cohorts. We have returned to our regular recess times of 10:25 in the morning and 2:25 in the afternoons with everyone Grade 1-5 outside at the same time. At lunch, we continue to have our Grade 4/5 students going out for lunch recess the first half of lunch hour and the Grade 1-3 students going outside the second half of the lunch hour. This is to assist our Lunch Supervisors with the outdoor supervision of the students. (On that note, we are once again looking for additional Lunch Supervisors to assist us in this 1 hour per day. We continue to monitor our reported Covid Absences (code V in our computer system). Weekly reported Covid related absences will be posted on our School Website each Friday.

Our staggered entries (8:50 & 8:55) and staggered dismissals (3:50 & 3:55) continue to avoid congestion in the halls and lockers at these times. Please plan your arrival and pick-up times accordingly. Note: There is no adult supervision on the playground or school grounds after dismissal.

We continue to be a mask friendly environment and to encourage mask wearing along with good hand hygiene and cough etiquette. Please see the attached new signage that will be posted at all SJASD schools.

Covid Isolation requirements for those who have tested positive and/or have symptoms of Covid-19 are for isolation for **5** days after a positive test date and/or until symptoms have improved over the past 24 hours and there is no fever present. Lingering symptoms such as a cough or loss of taste or smell can persist beyond the isolation period and are not reasons for continuing isolation. Close contacts are no longer being tracked nor notified unless an individual chooses to do so on their own.
