For Canadian citizens or permanent residents with a permanent disability who are enrolled full-time in a recognized post-secondary program; each year the program awards two bursaries of \$5,000 (one English, one French).

Canada Student Grant for Students with Disabilities

A federal grant for students with a recognized disability who enroll in a qualified program at a designated school — eligible students with financial need may receive up to \$2,800 per year, for every year of study.

Canadian Hard of Hearing Association

For students with hearing loss (hard of hearing, deafened, oral deaf) enrolled full-time in post-secondary studies; various sub-scholarships within the program award \$1,000 to \$2,000 depending on the category.

Canadian Hearing Services

Offers financial support for deaf or hard-of-hearing Canadian citizens or permanent residents attending post-secondary institutions; eligible full-time students can receive about \$3,000 per year (and lesser amount if part-time), renewable annually.

Awards one-time scholarships of \$5,000 to Canadian students living with Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis who are enrolled in a post-secondary program.

Deloitte Canada Scholarship for Students with Disabilities and Neurodiverse

Offers a one-time \$5,000 scholarship to Canadian post-secondary students who self-identify as having a disability or being neurodivergent (e.g. autism, ADHD, dyslexia, sensory, cognitive, learning or other impairments), plus the opportunity to complete a paid work-term at a Deloitte Canada office.

A Canada-wide online portal (run by NEADS) that collects and lists hundreds of scholarships, bursaries, and other financial aid options specifically for post-secondary students with disabilities, helping them identify supports across colleges and universities.

Diabetes Hope Foundation

A merit- and needs-based scholarship for Canadian students living with type 1 diabetes who are finishing high school and entering post-secondary, awarding \$3,000 to recipients who balance diabetes care, academic achievement, and community involvement.

Full Potential

Offers up to 20 entrance scholarships of \$1,000/year (renewable up to four years) plus virtual tutoring support (valued at \$5,000 over 4 years) for Canadian students with documented learning disabilities/gifts starting full-time post-secondary studies.

Grant for Students with Permanent Disabilities

Provides \$2,000 per academic year to Canadian post-secondary students with a permanent disability (proof required) to help with tuition, books, and accommodation costs.

Lupus Scholarship for Canadian Students

Awards one-time \$2,500 scholarships to Canadian students diagnosed with lupus who are entering or already enrolled in post-secondary education, to help cover tuition or educational expenses.

Manitoba Council for Exceptional Children

Offers four annual scholarships (typically \$750 each) to Manitoba students either pursuing post-secondary education or transitioning to post-school work/training, particularly those working toward careers supporting persons with exceptionalities or with exceptional needs themselves.

Manitoba Epilepsy

For Manitoba residents with diagnosed epilepsy or seizure disorders (and members of the relevant provincial association), these awards support post-secondary studies or trades training — amounts and eligibility vary depending on specific scholarship under the program.

Reading Learning Clinic

This award supports students in Manitoba who have a documented specific learning disability (e.g. dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia). Eligible applicants must be accepted into a full-time post-secondary program (university, college, vocational or technical) in Manitoba. The scholarship amount is up to \$200.

Rick Hansen Foundation for Youth with Disabilities

For Canadian youth under age 30 with a functional disability (permanent or episodic), enrolling full-time in a publicly funded post-secondary or training program; provides up to \$10,000 per year, up to a maximum of \$40,000 total over the duration of the program.
