Tips for Applying for Awards, Scholarships or Bursaries

- ❖ Get started early. Some scholarships are open now.
- ❖ Get reference letters early
- ❖ Begin writing application essay
- ❖ Be accurate and complete
- ❖ Be personal and specific
- ❖ Proofread your application
- ❖ Ask for help
- ❖ Keep your contact information current
- ❖ Use a proper email address
- ❖ Check your email account frequently
- ❖ Continue trying
- ❖ There is a lot of \$\$\$ available....Do the leg work and it will pay off.



Loran Award

The Loran Award supports promising young Canadians who show strength of character and a commitment to service in their communities, challenging them to fully realize their leadership potential.

- **DEADLINE: October 16, 2025**

Eligibility Criteria:

- Be entering university for the first time in September 2026.
- Present a minimum cumulative average of 85%.
- Hold Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Be born between January 1, 2004 and September 1, 2010.

Scholarships:

Loran Award is valued at about \$100,000 over four years of undergraduate study. It is in partnership with 25 Canadian universities and is considered an investment in an outstanding young person's future. (36 Loran awards)

Finalist awards \$6000 (54 one-time awards)

Provincial & Territorial Awards \$3000 (70 one-time awards)

Schulich Leader Scholarships

Schulich Leader Scholarships are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. 100 are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Half are valued at \$120,000 (over 4 years) for engineering scholarships and half are valued at \$100,000*(over 4 years) for science and math scholarships.

- Every high school in Canada **can nominate one graduating student** each year to apply for the scholarship.

Deadline: Feb 18, 2026

- **Selection Criteria:**

Nominees are evaluated based on academic excellence, leadership qualities, charisma, creativity, and financial need. The program aims to support students who demonstrate potential to become leaders in their fields

Differences between University and College

UNIVERSITY

- Academic in nature
- Select courses
- Admission based on academic performance
- Tuition is \$\$\$ per course
- Approximately \$8,000-\$10,000 per year for full courseload (30 credit hours)
- Minimum 3 years - degree

COLLEGE

- Academic and Practical component
- More structured program
- Admission based on first come, first served – waiting lists. Apply early!!!
- Tuition is \$\$\$ per program – can range from \$4000 to \$20,000
- Minimum 5 months - diploma





- 30 credits for high school graduation
- MA40 and EN40 plus 3 other 40S courses (+ PE40)
- 4 credits must be academic
- A minimum average of 70% over 3 Grade 12 courses, with no less than 60%
- One credit of Grade 12 English with a minimum grade of 60%

Université de Saint-Boniface Entrance Scholarships



- Must have Français 40S, Math 40S, and an additional 40S course in French
 - **Average 95 to 100%:** \$3250
 - **Average 90 to 94.9%:** \$2500
 - **Average 85 to 89.9%:** \$1750
 - **Average of 80 to 84.9%:** \$1000
- \$3000 for students whose First Language is not French (one time)
- AP course completion - \$200 (score of 4) - \$250 (score of 5) **per** course
- Official Minority Language Bursary (\$500) for students enrolled full-time at USB **every year**



Self- Reporting Grades (for University Applications)

- Self-reporting grades is part of the admission process.
- Self-reporting of grades for university admission is when students provide their own academic marks on their application, which the university will later verify with official transcripts.
- Expected Grades – marks you believe you will attain by the end of the course
- Final Grades – marks for completed Gr. 12 courses
- Mid-term and final marks are submitted to universities by Sturgeon Heights Collegiate

Conditional Acceptance Letter

- Students receive conditional acceptance letters and scholarship offers in May & June
- Decision is based on final January marks and April mid-term marks
- Scholarships may be adjusted up or down
- Offers may be revoked if you do NOT meet admission requirements.
