When is registration for the 2023-2024 school year?

Registration forms will be coming home with students on February 10th. They are due back to school on the 13th.

Will there be the possibility of online registration?

There are several online platforms parents feel they need to check; will these be reduced?

A goal of ours is to move toward centralizing a place where parents can easily access all information they need about their child's progress at school. We are looking specifically at how we can utilize the Microsoft 360 programs available to us.

Is there the ability to offer AP courses in French Immersion?

Unfortunately, AP courses are not available in French because the program originates from the USA. French Immersion students can take AP French in grade 12.

Can French Immersion students achieve the French Immersion Diploma and AP Certificate?

Yes. Students will be able to graduate with a French Immersion diploma and AP certificate(s).

What electives are available to students in French Immersion?

For 2023 - 2024 we are proud to be offering the following electives for French Immersion students:

Biologie, Chimie, Physique, Le cinéma, témoin de l'histoire moderne, Enjeux Mondiaux, Études de la Famille, Premières Nations, Métis et Inuits; sujets d'actualité et Psychologie. Section viability will be determined by student interest through registration.

Will there be the possibility for vocations to be available in French in the future?
