DIFFERENCES BETWEEN UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE

UNIVERSITY

- Academic in Nature
- Select Courses
- Admission based on academic performance
- Tuition is \$\$\$ per course
- Approximately \$6,000.00 per year for full courseload
- Minimum 3 years - degree

COLLEGE

- Practical – Hands on
- Structured Program
- Admission based on first come, first served – waiting lists
- Tuition is \$\$\$ per program – can range from \$3000.00 to \$10,000.00
- Minimum 5 months - diploma

GENERAL UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS AT U OF M

- **30 credits for high school graduation**
- **A minimum average of 70% over the following with no less than 60% in each course:**
 - English 40S
 - Math 40S
 - A third academic 40S course
 - A fourth academic 40S course

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR U OF W

- **30 credits for high school graduation**
- **5 credits at the Grade 12 level (+ PE40F)**
- **Average of 65%, calculated using:**
 - English 40S (or Français 40s)
 - Math 40S
 - 1 other 40S different subject area

Every student must complete an Indigenous Course Requirement- 3 credits



RED RIVER COLLEGE POLYTECHNIC

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Manitoba Grade 12 high school diploma
 - A network of choices meeting industry needs
 - Admission requirements and prerequisites vary greatly between programs
 - Check programs on the website: rrc.ca
 - Some courses are first come, first served - if so, you can apply now and get on the wait list.
 - For courses that are competitive, you will need final marks submitted 30 days after applying
 - You can check entry dates online – (waiting lists)
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SELF-REPORTING GRADES (U OF M, U OF W)

Self-reporting grades is part of the admission process.


Students will submit their:

Final Grades – marks for completed courses

Expected Grades – marks you believe you will attain by the end of the year.

Mid-Term and Final marks are submitted to universities by our School Division

SELF-REPORTING GRADES (U OF M, U OF W)

- Students receive admission and scholarship offers in May & June
 - Based on final marks and April mid-term marks
 - Offers will be **conditional** pending final marks
 - Scholarships may be **adjusted**
 - Offers may be **revoked** if you fail to meet admission requirements.
 - Questions? – Please meet with a counsellor.
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IMPORTANT DEADLINES

To be considered for automatic entrance scholarships, you must apply before:

- U of W & U of M - **March 1, 2023**
- Check post-secondary Viewbooks to make sure you have courses off their approved list for scholarship eligibility
(ex. U of M does not recognize PY40S or LW40S)
- Admission to faculties will be determined on your final January marks and your April mid-term marks.
- Can start applying online NOW!!!

UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG SPECIAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

- Based on the average of English 40S, Math 40S, and one other 40S credit from a different subject area.
- Automatically eligible with your application submitted before March 1.

• 95% or higher	\$2,250.00
• 90 – 94.9%	\$1,750.00
• 85– 89.9%	\$1,100.00

U OF M ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

- Average 95 to 100% \$3,000.00
- Average 90 to 94.9% \$2,000.00
- Average 85 to 89.9% \$1,000.00

Must have a minimum 85% average over 5 courses from approved list - page 39 in handbook/next slide.

 - Value is \$16,000.00 over four years
 - Chown Scholarship - \$1,000.00, School nominates student in June
