ITINERARY

DAY 1 MARCH 22, 2023 TRAVEL TO BELIZE

Today we will Travel to Belize via connections via YYZ

In the early afternoon we will arrive in Philip S.W. Goldson International Airport in Belize. We will Transer via private transportation to our eco lodge. Upon arrival at the lodge we will enjoy a welcome community lunch and orientation to our whole trip.

Following dinner, depart to the Belize Zoo for a special after-hours guided night tour to interact with Belize's unique fauna when they are most active – after dark – in their natural surroundings. Black howler monkey, Kinkajou, Gibnut, Coatimundi, Jaguar, Harpy eagle, Tapir and Morlette's crocodile to name a few. Overnight accommodations are bunkhouse beds in the dorms while the local staff prepares a wide variety of incredible meals and a library full of references on Belize are at your disposal.

DAY 2 March 23, 2023 Belize

DAY 3 MARCH 24, 2023 CAROCOL

We will head out to the Mayan Ruins of Carocol. The Carocol ruins which at one time in history had a population of about 185,000, cover an area of 75 square miles. The highlight of the stay in Pine Ridge is the is Big Rock Falls.

We'll head back to the lodge and go for a short hike & nature tour, ending with a swim in the pools at the bottom of the waterfalls. Afternoon Cool water rushes down, flies over smooth granite boulders, and then drops 150-feet straight into a crystal clear pool suitable for swimming.

DAYS 4 - 6 MARCH 25, 26, 27, 2023 T.R.E.E.S. RESEARCH AND EDUCATION STATION

Following breakfast you will enjoy a morning hike and swim at the Sibun River, then pack up and transfer to the T.R.E.E.S Hosting Center on the Hummingbird Highway to arrive in time for lunch.

The next three days will be spent working with ecologists that study the flora and fauna of the Maya Mountains of Belize. Here you will learn different field techniques to study birds, amphibians/reptiles, and mammals (including bats) as well as learn about stream ecology and how to sample macro-invertebrates and identify them in the lab.

Students will also get to design their own research project using the scientific method and field equipment available at T.R.E.E.S., with the help of T.R.E.E.S biologists on a topic of their choosing (example topics will be provided, including for ex. hummingbird behavior studies, leaf-cutter behavior/movement studies, orchid abundance counts, turtle movement and habitat use, etc.)

DAYS 7-9 MARCH 28, 29, 30 2023

The Belize Barrier Reef has been named by U.N.E.S.C.O. as a "World Heritage Site" and the waters surrounding Tobacco Caye Marine Station. Activities available during our time at the marine station will include:

- Fore Reef A leisurely drift snorkel adventure along Belize's Great Barrier Reef. Colorful, healthy spur and groove coral formations, spotted eagle rays, turtles, tarpon & grouper may join you as you drift along taking in this spectacular reef.
- Carrie Bow Caye A guided tour around the Smithsonian's research station. Visits to Carrie Bow Caye include a shallow depth snorkel around the islands reef where wrasses, octopus, and angelfish can regularly be found.
- Third Cut of the Reef This narrow channel location is where local deep water fish migrations funnel into the lagoon. Large groupers, schools of horse eyed jacks, and more can be regularly spotted.
- Twin Cayes A mangrove snorkel! A great opportunity to see seahorses, upside-down photosynthesizing jellyfish and possibly, the gentle giant Manatee!
- Whale Shoal Whale Shoal is a picture perfect patch reef where you're sure to see triggerfish, rock beauties, Creole wrasses, parrotfish and an assortment of angelfish. The coral gardens are also teeming with sea fans, large brain coral formations to stag horn coral!
- The Aquarium The name says it all! This shallow snorkel is delightfully abundant with colorful tropical fish and soft coral gardens.
- Tobacco Cut In this deep channel cut through the great barrier reef, you will have the opportunity to swim with stingrays, spotted eagle rays and sometimes even manta rays!

DAY 10 MARCH 31, 2023 BELIZE>WINNIPEG Travel back to Winnipeg with an overnight in YYZ

DAY 11 APRIL 1, 2023 YYZ>WINNIPEG Arrive by noon in Winnipeg.
