The month of October brings thoughts of gratitude. Thank-you to YOU; our community! For your support, generosity and commitment to helping our school be a better place. A place where all students come to school, feel safe and confident enough to take the risks necessary for learning. Thank-you to all staff who have worked so hard building relationships with their students and establishing classroom routines, expectations and positive communities, as well as working together to create such a positive school climate. We are well on our way to achieving our school goals and our classrooms and hallways are alive with an excitement about learning! Thank-you to our students, for all your hard work and for sharing your energy, spirit and passion for learning with all of us, each day. Thank-you also to Mme Rothwell, VP, and our dedicated Lunch Supervisors who support the lunch program and help provide a safe and happy lunch hour for our students. And, to parents who continue to support your children at home by reminding them of the Lunch Hour expectations both in the Lunchrooms and on the playground. Thank-you also for continuing to send healthy, nut-free lunches and providing re-usable utensils and containers in our effort to keep our Earth green! We do not supply utensils at lunch, so please be sure to send a spoon or fork with your child's lunch, if necessary. Our Milk Program, run by parent volunteers, offers students who purchase milk tickets, the option of choosing white or chocolate milk and over 90% of the sales is chocolate. Thank-you Charlene Hogg and Tasha Biefeni who continue to run the milk program.

Visitors: In the interest of safety, all visitors (including parents who are dropping students off late) are required to sign-in at the office if you are visiting the school or if your child is to be dismissed early. Please always use the front doors only and report directly to the office when entering the school. Please do not enter nor wait for your child inside either of the Daycare or back, playground doors at dismissal. These doors are for either daycare and student use only and all visitors must enter through the front doors and report to the office. Thank-you for helping keep all our students safe.

Parking: Please note that due to our increase in staff, there is now only one, visitor parking stall in the parking lot. It is the last stall, closest to the south, fence line. Please do not park in the other four spots as they are now reserved for school staff.

Steeped Tea Fundraiser: We are very excited to be launching a new, school-based fundraiser this year; Steeped Tea. AFTER-SCHOOL TEAM SPORTS**STUDENT RESPONSABILITIES and EXPECTATIONS**

Through our sports programs, we are providing opportunities for our students to learn how to become responsible, fair and accountable individuals. When signing the permission forms, please read over the team contract (on the back page) with your child before signing. ***If a student joins a school team, we strongly encourage that he/she fulfills the commitment that he/she has made by signing up for the team.***

It is extremely difficult to plan for practices, games and tournaments when students quit teams and/or don't go to games/practices. It is a continued expectation that students attend all team practices, meetings and games unless there is a valid reason for a student to not be there. Students are responsible for letting Mme Beaudin know a.s.a.p. when they are unable to attend a practice or a game that were scheduled to play. Daycare students are responsible for informing the daycare when they have games and whether or not they will be returning to the daycare after the game. Thank you for supporting our sports programs by helping us teach the students how to be fair and responsible athletes.

TRANSPORTATION

The after-school drop-in games, for those who have returned a signed permission form, start at 4:15 p.m. and end at 4:45 p.m. ***Parents/guardians are responsible for the transportation of their child to and from the games, the school will not be providing transportation to nor from the games.*** For the safety of our students, rides must be pre-arranged before the game. Failure to do may result in the student not participating in the game. If the games are at Bannatyne, the participating students will meet in the gym at dismissal time.

Please note that students will not be dismissed early from school on game days, they will be dismissed at the regular time of 3:55 p.m. For away games, students will be dismissed at 3:55 p.m. and will travel to the away game with their parent/guardian. On away game days, parents/guardians are asked to kindly wait for their children outside of the school in the normal dismissal area at 3:55 p.m. so that they do not interfere with the end of day dismissal procedures. Prior to the game, it is the responsibility of the daycare students/parents to inform the daycare that they are playing and whether or not they are returning to the daycare after the game. Thank you kindly for your cooperation with this and for helping to keep our students safe.

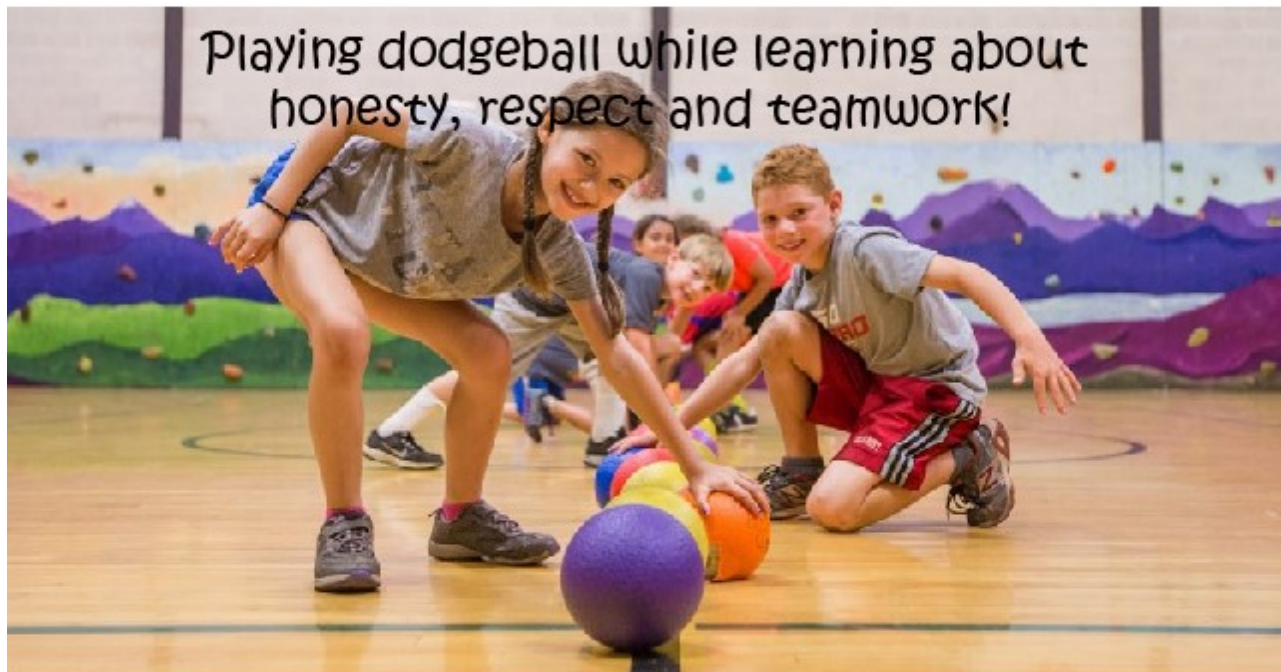
