Presented by Dr. Maria Phelps, School Psychologist

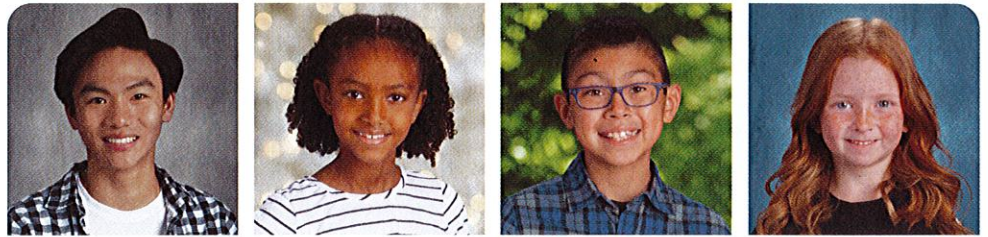
Does your child or teen have difficulty getting started or completing schoolwork?

T.A.I.L.S.

Therapy Animals involved in Literacy Skills

T.A.I.L.S. is a free, motivational, confidence building, low stress canine-assisted reading program for children (typically Grades K-5) who are experiencing difficulties with reading.

Certified dogs and handlers will provide a calming, non-judgemental environment for your child to read to a dog for 20 minutes once a week for 7 consecutive weeks.

- ◆ Children must have basic reading skills to be registered.
- ◆ Sessions will take place at 1 St. John Ambulance Way in Winnipeg on Wednesdays from **October 19** through **November 30, 2022**, with 3 timeslots to choose from; 6:00pm-6:20pm, 6:30-6:50pm or 7:00pm-7:20pm.
- ◆ Children must be available to attend all 7 sessions (unless an emergency or illness arises).
- ◆ Parent/guardian of children must remain onsite for the duration of the session. Waiting area will be available for parents/guardians.
