Human Ecology is a collective term that describes several courses, focussing on the interactions of human beings with their near environments. These courses were formerly categorized under the umbrella term "Home Economics".

The focus of human ecology is to prepare students for independent living and working successfully with others. Human ecology courses engage students in an action-oriented approach that builds capacity for decision making and problem-solving skills through everyday situations within the areas of family studies, food and nutrition, and textile arts and design.
